



School principals, counselors, and staff, we are proud this year to be able to offer a <u>free summer adventure</u> for 10 lucky Montana youth! Founded by a Montana school counselor, Project ASCENT is a non-profit corporation based in Thompson Falls, a pristine area of Montana surrounded by abundant rivers, lakes, and national forests. Project ASCENT has been offering free adventure education experiences for five years now in the northwest region of Montana. Our goal is to continue to expand our offerings to youth across our great state, and due to overwhelming support and success, this we are able to do just that!

Project ASCENT promotes community and individual wellness through experiential outdoor opportunities. Our aim is to encourage youth to increase awareness of their natural environment, challenge them with unique adventure education in the outdoors, and instill a sense of engagement and responsibility in preserving our natural world. Project ASCENT sets itself apart from other summer camps by offering all of our experiences free of charge to the camper! We provide a non-discriminatory field of applicants for all of our opportunities, maximizing our reach and impact. The holistic approach we take towards our camps achieves personal growth and positive relationship development. Opportunities to meet recreational and wilderness professionals in a service-learning atmosphere empowers youth with motivation to pursue career opportunities in fields that promote lifelong stewardship.

Exploring Our Scenic Waterways is a 4-day, 3-night kayaking pack trip designed to connect youth ages 12-17 to Montana's wild areas by immersing them in adventure activities. Campers will explore in kayaks over 30 miles of meandering river surrounded by breathtaking scenic views and ample opportunities for wildlife observation. Day one campers participate in preparatory and skill-based instruction. Our Swift Water and Flood Rescue Certified camp coordinators offer instructional sessions in basic kayak skills including paddling, reading and navigating water, water





safety and rescue, and packing a kayak with correct weight distribution. Other lessons feature Leave No Trace, fire safety, as well as wildlife awareness and conflict prevention. Camp set up and tear down are exercised in a group setting, encouraging growth in teamwork and leadership skills. To ensure a sense of personal responsibility, kayakers will be in charge of packing, loading, and carrying their own gear each day. A representative of the local tribe will join us and share the history of the area during the first of three reflective campfire talks held over the course of the trip. Day two we embark on our 30-mile journey filled with challenges and opportunities to build self-awareness, on and off the water. During the next three days campers will visit carefully selected historical sites along the river in order to observe and record evidence of human impact on our watersheds. This, in turn, heightens the camper's awareness of a connection between the environment and their personal choices and actions.

This year, being our first to offer our opportunities state-wide, we can only award this experience to 10 applicants across Montana. We expect our application pool to be competitive. We ask that you choose no more than 3 candidates that you feel will most benefit from this opportunity. Please assist them in filling out the application for this amazing transformational opportunity to disconnect from electronics and meet new and dynamic people, all the while exploring the beauty and depth of not only their surroundings, but themselves.






OUR GOALS




- To combat addiction and mental illness associated with a sedentary lifestyle by offering opportunities to participate in local outdoor recreational activities.
